On 29 February, in one of their many acts of depravity in Gaza, Israeli snipers and Merkava tanks opened fire on hungry Palestinians who had gathered to collect food. At least 112 were killed and hundreds more were wounded. Israel absurdly claimed 112 Palestinians, many with bullet holes in their heads, stampeded each other to death. This is part of Israel's ongoing effort, since 7 October 2023, to terrorise the 2.3 million Palestinian residents of the Gaza strip to flee for their lives across the border into the Sinai Peninsula and never be allowed to return. So far, over 31,341 Palestinians in Gaza are known to have been killed, 8,000 more are 'missing' beneath the rubble, and 73,134 more have been wounded. Many more face death due to starvation, thirst, and treatable diseases.

Amongst the dead are 132 journalists and media workers and members of their families and 142 members of the UNRWA (UN Relief and Works Agency). 70% of the buildings in Gaza have been destroyed or seriously damaged.

This monstrous act of genocide has rightly been condemned worldwide, with huge protests regularly in the global south and in the streets of Israel's allies. including the US, Britain, France, Germany and Australia. At the UN General Assembly of 12 December last year, 153 to 10 voted for an "immediate humanitarian ceasefire." 23 abstained. On 26 January, the International Court of Justice ruled that Israel
