- Since 2014, thirty-eight amendments to the Planning Framework have removed permit requirements and/or removed requirements to meet planning scheme provisions. These amendments have eroded the rights of communities set by the Planning and Environment Act to participate in planning decisions.
- 2 The Victorian Parliamentary Inquiry into Protections within the Victorian Planning Scheme was suspended by State Government through purported lack of time. The <u>'Inquiry into the protections</u> within the Victorian Planning Framework' was published as an interim report on 2nd August 2022.
- 3 This Plan was produced in response to a 2018 election pledge to better protect Melbourne's Green Wedges and Agricultural Land. It is complete but confined to the Planning Minister's 'desk' for the past 12 months.

The PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENT ACT 1987

Section 4: OBJECTIVES

- (1) The objectives of planning in Victoria are—
 - (a) to provide for the fair, orderly, economic and sustainable use, and development of land;
- (b) to provide for the protection of natural and man-made resources and the maintenance of ecological processes and genetic diversity;
- (c) to secure a pleasant, efficient and safe working, living and recreational environment for all Victorians and visitors to Victoria;
- (d) to conserve and enhance those buildings, areas or other places which are of scientific, aesthetic, architectural or historical interest, or otherwise of special cultural value;
- (e) to protect public utilities and other assets and enable the orderly provision and co ordination of public utilities and other facilities for the benefit of the community;
- (f) to facilitate development in accordance with the objectives set out in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e);
- S. 4(1)(fa) inserted by No. 47/2017 s. 5.
 - (fa) to facilitate the provision of affordable housing in Victoria;
 - (g) to balance the present and future interests of all Victorians.
